The anonymous romantic comedy *Mucedorus* was by all accounts the most popular play of the first half of the seventeenth century. First performed around 1590, the play has long been a part of the Shakespeare apocrypha, and recent evidence suggests that Shakespeare did indeed write part of the play. *Mucedorus* was performed before both Elizabeth I and James I, but we know of no performance in modern times.
